# "If ye Are Not One ye Are Not Mine"

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- 1. <u>Scripture Hop</u> –Follow instructions on page 3 below for a scripture hop for D&C 38:27.
- 2. <u>"1" Poster Activity</u> (idea from manual)
  - Talk about what the words to D&C 38:27 mean. What does it mean to "be one"? How can we "be one" with others?
  - Count the number of people in our family. Why is each person important to our family? Together we are ONE family. Decorate the #1 poster on page 4 below with names, drawings, or pictures of each family member. What can we do to be more united as a family?
  - You could also make your own #1 sign on a large posterboard if you want a bigger size to decorate.
- 3. <u>Song</u> D&C 38:25 says, "And again I say unto you, let every man esteem his brother as himself." Talk about what that means. Watch this <u>5-minute singing time video</u> to learn sign language and sing "Jesus Said Love Everyone."
- 4. <u>Parable of the Ingredients</u> Read "The Parable of the Ingredients" on pages 8-9 below. Have the stick puppets of the ingredients cut out and ready to use for this. Read the story out loud. Each time the kids hear the names of the ingredients, they'll hold up the stick puppet that goes along with it. (Special thanks to Crystal at theredcrystal.org for designing these so perfectly for us!)
  - If you want to download this parable story with instructions and printables separately, here's the link.
  - Note: There are 9 total ingredients, and each has a smiling version as well as a frowning version. We are planning on taping the smiley version and the frowny version back-to-back on a stick. Then, when it's being held up, we can turn it to the side that shows each ingredient's emotion at that point of the story. On ours, we used the black-and-white version for the sad/scared side and the colored version for the happy side. If you want to simplify a little, you can either just use the frowny or smiley versions alone. There are black-and-white as well as color versions on the pages below.
  - It could also be fun to get a real mixing bowl to put the ingredients into for the ending part of the story.









- 5. <u>Role-Play</u> Role-play ways we can love others, comfort them, and help carry their burdens. Each person take a turn pretending to be worried/lonely/sad/stressed/etc. while other family members role-play how to help that person. How are we "one" with others when we help them?
  - Read "<u>A Card for Grandma</u>" (from the April 2021 Friend magazine) and then make heart notes to give to
    others. Deliver with chocolate chip cookies. Smaller printable versions of these heart notes are on page
    7 below.
  - Testify of the importance of loving others, helping others, and being united. Remind them of Jesus's love for us and those around us.
- 6. <u>Treat</u> Make chocolate chip cookies and deliver them to people with the heart notes.
  - This Unity Cake also looks like it could be a fun thing to do.
- 7. When I Get Baptized, I Promise to Help Others (We'll probably do this part of the lesson on a totally separate day). When we're baptized, we promise to comfort people and help carry their burdens.
  - Talk about baptism in as much depth as needed. This "<u>Understanding Baptism</u>" Questions and Answers article from *The Ensign* has some great things to talk about with kids. We will probably have Mom/Dad ask the questions to kids, see if they can think of any answers, then read the answers in the article.
  - Depending on time/interest, you can also talk about how we get the gift of the Holy Ghost when we're confirmed. The Holy Ghost has many roles. One of these is to help us feel warm inside when we make right choices, such as showing kindness to others.


# SCRIPTURE HOP

Cut apart the following strips and spread them out far enough in a room so that the kids will need to hop from one strip to another. Make sure to keep them in the correct order. Have them stand by the first one and help them say the top line out loud. Explain what it means. Then have them jump to the next one and do the same thing until they've jumped on each of them, said them out loud, and discussed them one at a time. Then have them start back at the beginning and practice saying the phrases from this verse in order while hopping from strip to strip again. Try going a little faster each time. Repeat as many times as wanted/needed. These can also be used as flash cards, taped onto the wall to practice throughout the week, etc.




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



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#### Parable of the Ingredients


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




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### Tours:
