

## Parable of the Ingredients

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## INSTRUCTIONS:

- There are 9 ingredient stick puppets that will need to be put together for this (flour, baking soda, salt, butter, vanilla, eggs, white sugar, brown sugar, and chocolate chips). There are black-and-white as well as color versions of these on the pages below.
- Each ingredient has a smiling version as well as a frowning version. Tape the smiley version and the frowny version onto colored paper and place them back-to-back on a popsicle stick. On ours, we used the black-and-white version for the sad/scared side and the colored version for the happy side. This made it easier for the kids to quickly know which side was which. (If you want to simplify, you can just do one-sided and choose either the smiley version or frowny version)

- Assign different people to be in charge of different ingredient stick puppets.
- Read "The Parable of the Ingredients" story out loud. (Origins of story unknown, shared as told by Delaney Nalder)
- As the story is being read out loud, listen carefully for each of the ingredients. As each is mentioned in the story, whoever has that stick puppet will hold up the stick puppet on the side that shows that ingredient's emotion at that point of the story.
- It could also be fun to get a real mixing bowl to put the ingredients into for the ending of the story.


## Parable of the Ingredients <br> Story Origin Unknown
