- Scripture Hop Watch "What is the Purpose of Family?" one-minute video from the church. Give a quick explanation of the Family Proclamation. Explain that today's scripture hop is a small piece of this proclamation. Follow directions on page 3 below.
- 2. <u>Family Proclamation for Kids</u> –Print pages 4-5 below to make and read the Family Proclamation for Kids. The wording for this comes directly from the church's website, which also has some great ideas for teaching the Family Proclamation to kids (see <u>this link</u> for details). We've used this with our kids in the past, but I think it's so important to review the concepts in it. Since we've done it before, we'll probably just read the pages and discuss each, but if you need something to better keep the attention of the kids you're teaching, you could also use the interactive version we made a couple years ago to help break it up. The interactive version can be found at <u>this link</u> (use pages 3-5). You could also cut apart each page, hide them, and discuss them as they're found.
 - Note: Page 6 of this mentions that men and women can use their bodies to create babies together. If your kids are super young and you want something a little less specific that just says that men and women need to be married before they have babies, <u>click here for another version</u>.



 Defend the Proclamation Role-Play – One of the talks linked in the manual is "<u>Defenders of the Family</u> <u>Proclamation</u>" by Bonnie L. Oscarson. I thought it was great, and if you have older family members, it could be great to read it with them. Since our kids are younger, this is our plan:



- Show picture of Marie Madeline Cardon. Explain that she was a girl who lived in Italy. She stood up to angry mobs in order to defend the church.
- Sister Oscarson said, "I would like to issue a challenge for all of us as women of the Church to be defenders of "The Family: A Proclamation to the World." Just as Marie Madeline Cardon courageously defended the missionaries and her newly found beliefs, we need to boldly defend the Lord's revealed doctrines describing marriage, families, the divine roles of men and women, and the importance of homes as sacred places—even when the world is shouting in our ears that these principles are outdated, limiting, or no longer relevant. Everyone, no matter what their marital circumstance or number of children, can be defenders of the Lord's plan described in the family proclamation. If it is the Lord's plan, it should also be our plan!"
- <u>Role-Play</u>: Take turns holding the Family Proclamation while defending it against different scenarios. Help the kids practice defending what it says about marriage, parenthood, and the home in loving ways. Some things you could say to them could include:
 - It's not cool to spend time with your family.
 - It's not important to get married to a righteous person.
 - Being a righteous mother/father/daughter/son isn't important.

- 4. <u>"I Can" Handprint Activity</u> Read page 6 below (from *The Friend*). Then have each family member trace their hands on paper, cut them out, and glue everyone's hands together in a line while talking about how they're an important part of the family.
 - You could also help them write one of these "I Can" statements on their hand:
 - ➤I Can Help My Family Be Strong
 - ≻I Can Bring Happiness, Kindness, and Love to My Family.
 - ≻I Can Listen to My Family, Work and Play Together, Forgive, and Help Each Other.
 - ➤I Can Read the Scriptures With My Family
 - ≻I Can Be A Good Example to My Family as I Pray and Keep the Commandments.
- 5. <u>Mini Love Notes</u> Watch "<u>What Matters Most</u>" video from the church. Mom/Dad have notes already written to kids telling them how much we love them. Then have everyone write notes to family members or others we love (can use the mini "I Love You" notes on page below or make your own). I was thinking it could be fun to mail some of these out to family members as well, and maybe include small treats with them.
- 6. <u>Song/Popsicle Stick Manger Craft</u> Review the phrase from the Proclamation: "Happiness in family life is most likely to be achieved when founded upon the teachings of the Lord Jesus Christ."
 - Sing/watch this <u>sing-a-long video for "Away in a Manger</u>" while reviewing why His birth is important to us.
 - Use popsicle sticks to build a manger. Follow instructions found <u>here</u>.
- 7. <u>Favorite Family Treat</u> Let everyone work together to help make a favorite family treat.




"I Am a Child of God" Sing-a-long



Cut apart the following strips and spread them out far enough in a room so that the kids will need to hop from one strip to another. Make sure to keep them in the correct order. Have them stand by the first one and help them say the top line out loud. Explain what it means. Then have them jump to the next one and do the same thing until they've jumped on each of them, said them out loud, and discussed them one at a time. Then have them start back at the beginning and practice saying the phrases in order while hopping from strip to strip again. Try going a little faster each time. Repeat as many times as wanted/needed. These can also be used as flash cards, taped onto the wall to practice throughout the week, etc.







You can listen to each other, work and play together, forgive and help each other.



THE FAMILY A PROCLAMATION TO THE WORLD

The First Presidency and Council of the Twelve Apostles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints

WE, THE FIRST PRESIDENCY and the Council of the Twelve Apostles of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, solemnly proclaim that marriage between a man and a woman is ordained of God and that the family is central to the Creator's plan for the eternal destiny of His children.

ALL HUMAN BEINGS—male and female—are created in the image of God. Each is a beloved spirit son or daughter of heavenly parents, and, as such, each has a divine nature and destiny. Gender is an essential characteristic of individual premortal, mortal, and eternal identity and purpose.

IN THE PREMORTAL REALM, spirit sons and daughters knew and worshipped God as their Eternal Father and accepted His plan by which His children could obtain a physical body and gain earthly experience to progress toward perfection and ultimately realize their divine destiny as heirs of eternal life. The divine plan of happiness enables family relationships to be perpetuated beyond the grave. Sacred ordinances and covenants available in holy temples make it possible for individuals to return to the presence of God and for families to be united eternally.

THE FIRST COMMANDMENT that God gave to Adam and Eve pertained to their potential for parenthood as husband and wife. We declare that God's commandment for His children to multiply and replenish the earth remains in force. We further declare that God has commanded that the sacred powers of procreation are to be employed only between man and woman, lawfully wedded as husband and wife.

 W_E DECLARE the means by which mortal life is created to be divinely appointed. We affirm the sanctity of life and of its importance in God's eternal plan.

HUSBAND AND WIFE have a solemn responsibility to love and care for each other and for their children. "Children are an heritage of the Lord" (Psalm 127:3). Parents have a sacred duty to rear their children in love and righteousness, to provide for their physical and spiritual needs, and to teach them to love and serve one another, observe the commandments of God, and be law-abiding citizens wherever they live. Husbands and wives mothers and fathers—will be held accountable before God for the discharge of these obligations.

THE FAMILY is ordained of God. Marriage between man and woman is essential to His eternal plan. Children are entitled to birth within the bonds of matrimony, and to be reared by a father and a mother who honor marital vows with complete fidelity. Happiness in family life is most likely to be achieved when founded upon the teachings of the Lord Jesus Christ. Successful marriages and families are established and maintained on principles of faith, prayer, repentance, forgiveness, respect, love, compassion, work, and wholesome recreational activities. By divine design, fathers are to preside over their families in love and righteousness and are responsible to provide the necessities of life and protection for their families. Mothers are primarily responsible for the nurture of their children. In these sacred responsibilities, fathers and mothers are obligated to help one another as equal partners. Disability, death, or other circumstances may necessitate individual adaptation. Extended families should lend support when needed.

WE WARN that individuals who violate covenants of chastity, who abuse spouse or offspring, or who fail to fulfill family responsibilities will one day stand accountable before God. Further, we warn that the disintegration of the family will bring upon individuals, communities, and nations the calamities foretold by ancient and modern prophets.

WE CALL UPON responsible citizens and officers of government everywhere to promote those measures designed to maintain and strengthen the family as the fundamental unit of society.

This proclamation was read by President Gordon B. Hinckley as part of his message at the General Relief Society Meeting held September 23, 1995, in Salt Lake City, Ultah.
