


"Noah found grace in the Eyes of the Lord"

- 1. <u>Noah Video/Story</u> Ask what they know about the story of Noah. Then have them help read the Noah story on pages 4-5 below and watch "<u>Noah and His Family</u>." Tell them to listen carefully to hear if Noah and his family obeyed the Lord or not.
 - This "Noah" story from *The Friend* could also be good to read along with learning this story.
 - Latter Day Kids made this cute Noah's Ark video too.
- 2. Make an Ark (Follow the Prophets and God's Words) Build an ark! Use whatever materials you have to build an ark. Make this as simple or as complicated as you feel like. You could: use blankets/chairs to build a fort-like ark, draw one on paper, use a shoebox, popsicle sticks, blocks, pretend the couch is an ark, or whatever other ideas you have. If you click on the picture below, there is a fun 3D printable, or theredcrystal also has a cute printable boat on her website. While building your ark, talk about how Noah had faith to follow what God told him to do, even though it wasn't raining yet! If you are doing this with older kids, you could also have everyone write specific words of counsel prophets have given us and put those words of counsel on the ark.



- 3. <u>Noah's Musical Ark Game</u> Follow instructions on pages 6-7 below to help the kids gather animals into the ark while role-playing how following the words of the prophets is like leading us into the safety of the ark.
- 4. <u>Friend Story/How Will I Follow the Prophet?</u> Talk about ways we can follow the prophets in our lives. How are we kept safe from dangers when we do?
 - Read and discuss "<u>Safety from the Storm</u>" from The Friend.
 - Have each person draw themselves obeying something specific that the prophet has taught us to do. Place their pictures in the ark while reminding them that it will bring safety and peace to their lives.
 - Fill out the "Scripture Draw" on page 3 below.


- 5. <u>Rainbow Coloring</u> The manual suggests: "Young children might enjoy drawing or coloring a rainbow while you talk about what it represents (see also <u>Joseph Smith Translation</u>, <u>Genesis 9:21–25</u> [in the Bible appendix]). You might also discuss things that help us remember our covenants, such as the sacrament, which helps us remember our baptismal covenant to follow Jesus Christ (see <u>Doctrine</u> and <u>Covenants 20:75–79</u>)."
 - There is a printable rainbow on page 8 below that can be used for this.
- 6. <u>Safety through Jesus</u> Explain that Jesus wants us to be in the safety of the ark of His gospel. He and Heavenly Father have created ways for us to be safe from harmful things in the world and return to them. The Atonement of Jesus Christ is what can help us truly have that safety.
 - From the manual: "It might be helpful to read <u>Ether 1:33–43</u> as your family studies <u>Genesis 11</u> and learns about the Tower of Babel. What do we learn from the families of Jared and his brother that can help our family find spiritual safety despite the wickedness in the world? What additional lessons do we learn from Noah and his family as they faced a similar challenge? (see <u>Moses 8:13, 16–30</u>)."
 - We'll probably just summarize the fact that Noah and his family had to rely on Christ and not others in the world to find true safety. Then briefly summarize the story of the Tower of Babel and how people tried building a tower to get close to Jesus and heaven. Is that the best way to get close to Jesus? What things can we do that will actually get us closer to Him?
 - Testify how our focus needs to remain on Jesus. Other people or situations in our lives might try to take our focus away from things we can do that will actually get us closer to Jesus. How can we stay strong in our faith, remember Jesus, and follow Him, no matter what else is happening around us?
- 7. <u>Treat (Fruit Loop Rainbow)</u> Use marshmallows, Fruit Loops, and a pipe cleaner to make this rainbow treat from howtohomeschoolmychild.com while reminding them how important they are to Heavenly Father and Jesus. Heavenly Father and Jesus will always remember each one of us.





NOAH'S MUSICAL ARK GAME

There is spiritual safety in following the prophet, just like the ark kept Noah's family and the animals safe from the floods! For this game, we are going to help animals get in the ark so they can be safe!

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Place the following animal cards in a large circle around something representing an ark (a box, a fort-like ark made out of chairs/blankets, an envelope with a picture of an ark, etc.).
- Play the song "Follow the Prophet" while everyone walks around the circle. Stop the music at random times.

 When the music stops, each person will pick up the animal card they're closest to, read the card, and role-play how those animals could follow the prophet. If their response is appropriate, they can place that animal in the safety of the ark. Repeat until all animals are safe in the ark.
