- 1. <u>Moses Review/10 Commandment Video</u> Review what we've learned about Moses and the Israelites. Then watch the "<u>Moses on Mount Sinai</u>" video from the church and talk about the 10 commandments that he received.
- 2. <u>10 Commandments Matching Game</u> Play the matching game on page 4 below to help discuss the commandments (created by Crystal from theredcrystal). As each match is found, discuss what that commandment means and how it applies to us. <u>This link from the church</u> has a few explanations of what some of these commandments mean.
 - <u>Note</u>: There are 2 versions of the game below. The one on page 4 has only the 10 commandments found in Exodus 20. The advanced version on page 5 has additional important commandments.
 - <u>Tip</u>: It could also be a good idea to glue these onto construction paper before cutting out so that they are not see-through.
- 3. <u>Decide Now</u> Read "<u>Decide Right Now</u>" story from *The Friend*. Tell them to pay close attention to which of the 10 commandments the boy in this story had to choose whether to follow or not. Look at the commandment pictures we used for the matching game one at a time and have each person commit now to following those. Remind them to be like the boy in the story, who realized it's important to ALWAYS keep the commandments and not justify breaking them.
- 4. <u>Keep the Commandments Singalong and Craft</u> Watch <u>this singalong video for "Keep the Commandments</u>." If you want to do the craft with the song, make sure you have paper plates, strips of paper, and tape. Testify of the safety and peace we receive from choosing to keep the commandments.
- 5. Role-Play Choose one commandment to focus on in depth. Discuss it and role-play situations where they could practice following that commandment. Our kids could use a little extra practice with honoring Mom and Dad and telling the truth, so we'll probably focus on situations revolving around those. Remind them that "honoring" means more than just obeying. The manual also suggests choosing a commandment or two to focus on each day and discussing it together in more detail.
- 6. <u>Scripture Draw</u> Remind them that God gives us commandments because He loves us. When we keep the commandments, it shows our love for God and brings blessings into our lives. Share examples of times you've seen them do a great job at following certain commandments. Have each kid choose one commandment that they want to be better at following and draw a picture of it on the scripture draw sheet on page 3 below.

7. <u>Treat</u> – Make a Ten Commandment treat while reviewing the commandments. Click on the links below for a few possible ideas.









